#### Year 1









### Year 2



### Were you aware that:

90% attendance is equivalent to having a day off every two weeks

80% attendance is equivalent to having a day off every week

There is a direct correlation between poor attendance and pupil progress

10 or more sessions of unauthorised absence could lead to a Penalty Notice or in worst case legal action

10 or more sessions of unauthorised absence for a family holiday will lead to a Penalty Notice per parent, per child

Arrival after the close of registration will be marked as unauthorised absence code U which will also affect attendance

Medical appointments are to be made outside of school hours or during school holidays.

Where this is not possible this information should be provided to the school office in the form of an appointment card, letter, email or text message
