Topic Overview

What a busy first half term! The children have settled so well into school life. Thank you for your continued support with daily reading, for supporting your child learning their phonics and for writing so many brilliant observations on tapestry. It is so nice to see how the children are continuing their learning at home.

Our next topic is Celebrations. We are going to be exploring Autumn, Bonfire night, celebrating birthdays and of course Christmas.

English Communication & Language

- We will be sharing the traditional tales 'Little Red Hen' & 'Goldilocks and the three bears' and reading 'Pumpkin soup' and Christmas stories
- We will listen to and create fireworks poems
- We will continue to learn phase 2 phonemes and to apply these to read and write
- We will learn to write our name, lists, instructions and simple sentences

Mathematical Development

- We will be saying, recognising and using number names in order to 10/20
- Use objects to add and subtract single digit numbers
- We will count objects reliably to 10
- Represent and use number bonds within 6 (1 + 5, 2 + 4, 3 + 3, etc)
- We will learn to write numbers to 10
- We will use the language of more and less and heavier and lighter
- We will learn about 2D and 3D shapes
